| WRRCS1B | Communicate in the workplace | Students will learn the skills, knowledge and attitudes required for effective communication with clients and other staff in the workplace. |
| WRRLP1B | Apply safe working practices | This unit incorporates the National Occupational Health and Safety Commission (NOHSC) guidelines for occupational health and safety. |
| HLTIN 301A | Comply with infection control policies and procedures in health work | This unit describes the skills and knowledge required for workers to comply with infection control policies and procedures in accordance with current Australian and New Zealand standards for maintaining infection control. |
| WRRS1B | Sell products and services | Students will learn communication and research skills to be able to develop and apply knowledge of products, services and treatments to create a buying environment. |
| WRBCS 305A | Apply knowledge of skin biology to beauty treatments | This unit provides students with knowledge of skin biology in relation to aesthetic therapies |
| WRBCS 409A | Apply knowledge of skin science to beauty therapy treatments | The student will learn an in depth knowledge of skin science and skin disorders to address advanced aesthetic treatments |
| WRBFS 407B | Provide Advanced Facial treatments | The students will learn a higher level of skills and knowledge required for the assessment of client's skin and the performance of advanced facial treatment procedures. |
| WRBFS 406B | Provide Facial treatments | The students will learn the skills and knowledge required to perform a range of manual facials and skin treatments. |
| WRBCS 410A | Apply knowledge of electricity to beauty therapy treatments | This unit provides students with the knowledge required to apply the principles of electricity to beauty therapy treatments. |
| WRBCS 407A | Develop a treatment plan for beauty therapy treatments | This unit provides the basis for assessing client treatment needs and developing a treatment plan which may involve more than one treatment or service. |
| HLTCOM 404B | Communicate effectively with clients | This unit covers the skills required by practioners to establish and maintain effective communication with the patient/client throughout all interactions and as is appropriate to facilitate the treatment. |
| WRBCS 412A | Apply knowledge of cosmetic chemistry to beauty therapy treatments | This unit requires students to demonstrate an understanding of cosmetic chemistry in relation to aesthetic treatments. |
| WRBCS 411A | Apply knowledge of nutrition to beauty therapy treatments | In this unit students will develop an understanding of nutrition in relation to aesthetic treatments. |
| HLTNUT 601A | Provide basic dietary advice | This unit enables the student to be able to provide dietary advice and make changes to the diet to enhance patient/client treatments. |
| WRBBS 514A | Provide superficial lymphatic drainage | This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to provide manual superficial lymphatic drainage massage for the face and body |
| HMS 1 | Anatomy and histology (A & B) | (A)This unit enables the student to describe the gross anatomy of the human body and the histology of cells, tissues and organs. (B) Is a continuation on HMS 1 with emphasis on systems of the body and their functions. |
| HMS 2 | Anatomy and histology (B) | A continuation on HMS 1 with emphasis on systems of the human body and their functions. |
| HMS 3 | Physiology and Biochemistry (A) | Enables the participants to describe and explain the physiology of the main systems of the human body and to understand the major biochemical processes at the chemical and cellular level and relate to the metabolic process of the human body. |
| HMS 4 | Physiology and Biochemistry (B) | A continuation on HMS 3 with emphasis on vascular, lymphatic, respiratory, urinary, endocrinology, reproduction, nervous and thermoregulation. |

| AESTH 601A | Provide chemical peeling procedures in skin therapy | This unit describes an advanced level of skills and knowledge required for assessment of a client's skin and the performance of chemical peels to be used in clinical practice. |
| AESTH 602A | Use electrical equipment in advanced aesthetic treatments | This unit describes an advanced level of skills and knowledge required for assessment of the clients' skin and the application of equipment used in advanced aesthetic treatments such as I.P.L for hair reduction and skin rejuvenation, Micro-Current for non-surgical facelift treatments, Low Intensity Laser, advanced Micro-Dermabrasion and L.E.D to enhance treatment outcomes. |
| AESTH 603A | Develop paramedical skincare product knowledge | This unit covers the development of paramedical skincare product knowledge for use in advanced aesthetic treatments and their suitability for different skin types and disorders. |
| AESTH 604A | Develop and coordinate a referral system for surgical and non-surgical procedures | This unit examines various surgical and non-surgical procedures giving recommendations for these procedures through a referral system and to perform pre and post operative treatments in preparation for surgical and non-surgical procedures. |

| AESTH 605A | Perform cosmetic injections and dermal filling procedures <i>Pre Requisite - Registered or Endorsed Enrolled Nurse</i> | This unit requires an advanced level of skills and knowledge required for assessment of the clients facial structure and the performance of cosmetic injections and dermal filling used in clinical practice. |
| Stream 2 | | |
| WRBSS 503B | Provide permanent epilation | This unit describes the skills and knowledge to analyse the permanent progressive hair removal needs of clients and provide the necessary service in a safe hygienic manner. |
| WRBSS 504B | Perform diathermy services | This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to apply electrical equipment and procedures to treat dilated capillaries. |
| Stream 3 | | |
| HLTIN402B | Maintain infection control standards in office practice settings | This unit describes the skills and knowledge required of health care workers in office practice settings to comply with infection control regulations and standards to manage and control infection risks to clients, themselves and other health care workers. |
| WRBSS505B | Design and perform cosmetic tattooing / micro pigmentation procedures | This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to perform a range of cosmetic tattooing / micro pigmentation procedures. The therapist will learn to develop a treatment plan and apply pigments and electrical equipment to perform remedial and aesthetic cosmetic tattooing. |
| WRBFS 204B | Design and apply remedial camouflage makeup | Students will gain the skills and knowledge required to assess facial and body areas requiring remedial camouflage and to apply appropriate make-up, specialised products and application techniques. |
