WRRCs 1B WRRER 1B	Communication	Students will learn the skills, knowledge and attitudes required for effective communication with clients and other staff in the workplace. Their learning also includes the skills, knowledge and attitudes required to work effectively in a retail environment.
WRRLP 1B	Workplace Health and Safety	This unit incorporates the National Occupational Health and Safety Commission (NOHSC) guidelines for occupational health and safety.
WRBCS201B WRBCS306B WRR1 1B WRBCS 203B WRRS 1B WRBCS 513B	Sales and Selling	Students will learn communication and research skills to be able to develop and apply knowledge of products, services and treatments to create a buying environment. Designed to supply the student with the skills and knowledge to plan and implement a display for a small retail business, dealing with difficult customers, establishing and maintaining a customer database and conducting sales presentations in a retail environment.
WRBCS 204A WRBBS 201B	Nail Services	This unit provides students with the skills and knowledge to assess the needs of clients, perform a range of hand and foot care services, and an understanding of nail science.
WRBCS 305A	Apply knowledge of skin biology to beauty treatments	This unit provides students with knowledge of skin biology in relation to beauty therapy.
WRBFS 202B	Make-up	This unit will supply students with the skills and knowledge to analyse a client's skin type and facial shape, and design and apply make-up using appropriate products and techniques.
WRBSS 201B	Pierce ears	This unit requires students to assess the ear lobe piercing needs of clients and advise on and perform the service.
WRBFS 305B	Provide lash and brow treatments	Students will learn to assess client requirements and perform a range of services, including brow and lash colouring, brow shaping and lash perming.
WRBSS 302B	Provide temporary epilation & bleaching treatments	Students will learn to assess the temporary hair removal/bleaching needs of clients and perform the required services.
WRBCS 408A	Apply knowledge of anatomy and physiology to beauty therapy treatments	Students will learn an understanding of anatomy and physiology to identify and analyse client needs, perform beauty therapy treatments and provide aftercare service and advice.
WRBCS 412A	Apply knowledge of cosmetic chemistry to beauty therapy treatments	This unit requires students to demonstrate an understanding of cosmetic chemistry in relation to beauty therapy treatments.
WRBCS 411A	Apply knowledge of nutrition to beauty therapy treatments	In this unit students will develop an understanding of nutrition in relation to beauty therapy treatments.
WRBCS 407A	Develop a treatment plan for beauty therapy treatments	This unit provides the basis for assessing client treatment needs and developing a treatment plan which may involve more than one treatment or service.

WRBCS 409A WRBFS 406B WRBFS 407B WRBCS 410A	<b>Facial Services</b>	Students will learn skin science and skin disorders, to interpret the client's treatment plan and apply a range of facial treatments including cleansing and preparing the face, applying skin care products and manual massage routines. Students will also learn to interpret a treatment plan and apply a range of products and electrical equipment to perform facial treatments for a range of skin conditions.
WRBBS 407B WRBBS 408B WRBBS 509A WRBBS 510A WRBBS 511A WRBBS 512A WRBBS 513A WRBBS 514A	<b>Body Services</b>	Students will learn to interpret a treatment plan and apply a range of manual and electrical body treatments, including exfoliation and body wraps. This unit also includes the application of techniques for body massage. Students will also learn to prepare clients for basic massage and negotiate treatment with them, as well as incorporate some basic essential oils for an aromatic massage. The techniques in this unit will provide the student with the ability to interpret a client treatment plan and apply a range of pre-blended aromatic plant oils using a range of massage movements and techniques. Also included learning to apply basic reflexology relaxation techniques and superficial manual lymph drainage massage techniques. The student will learn to consult with clients to select and sequence a range of spa treatments and prepare clients for the spa experience. Techniques learnt in this unit will provide the student with the skills and knowledge to provide a range of spa treatments according to a defined plan.
<b>Our business management unit is not a requirement of the Diploma of Beauty Therapy, although we recommend to our students that they complete this unit, or at least sit in on classes, as there is no extra cost.</b>		
	<b>Suzettes Business Management</b>	This unit takes the student through the research and development of a business plan to achieve salon/spa business goals and objectives. Students will have the opportunity to listen to stories and advice from Suzette Barlin, Principal of the Gold Coast Training Academy; who has had 30 years experience owning and operating various salons both in Canberra and on the Gold Coast. This unit is useful for those wishing to open their own salon or spa, or aspiring to achieve management status within a salon or spa.
